

Remarks:

- 1) *Yugoslavia – after 1991 (consisted of Serbia and Montenegro)
- 2) Doubles competitions were introduced at World championship 1966 and were played until 2006.
From 1966 – 2002, 2x 200 balls, and in 2004 and 2006 2x 120 balls have been played. Since then, various mix, tandem, sprint, etc. competitions have taken place, but they have not been taken into consideration for the ranking on this list.
- 3) German Dem. Republic (GDR) participated in the WC only from 1953 – 1972
- 4) Yugoslavia* was during 1994 under a UN embargo, and its athletes were banned from participating in the WC 1994 in Ludwigshafen.
- 5) The only European Championship (Teams, Doubles & Singles) was played in 1964 in Budapest
(the same format and participating nations as in WC).

- 6) From 1953-2004 the single world champions were determined based on the performance from 3 appearances (each time 200 balls - team, doubles and singles), with the exception of 2004, when 3x120 balls were played.
- 7) 1990 in addition to the combination, the competition for individual winners was introduced, based only on the final performance (until 2004).
- 8) 2006 the winners were determined based on the total score from preliminaries and final.
- 9) From 2008 the combination winners are determined based on the best scores from sprint and singles.
